EPI's Photovoice training introduces photovoice as a method and tool that can extend and amplify Everyday Peace Indicators (EPI) projects. Participants will learn about photovoice as an action research method and how participatory visual methods can be harnessed to deepen community engagement with indicators, to support local priorities and processes, and to enable communities to communicate their concerns to audiences locally, nationally, and internationally.

Trainers

Tiffany Fairey has been working with photovoice as both a practitioner and researcher for over 25 years. She is a [Senior Research Fellow](#) based in the Department of War Studies, King's College London and Photovoice Associate with Everyday Peace Indicators. Her current research, [Imaging Peace](#), focuses on the role of images and image-making in building peace and dialogue. It builds on her research into [Art & Reconciliation](#) and arts-based peacebuilding. Co-founder and director of the award-winning charity [PhotoVoice](#), Fairey has worked on more than 50 participatory visual projects with communities in the UK and around the world, pioneering ethical practice in this field. Her work has been recognised with various awards including a Leverhulme Fellowship and the Royal Photographic Society's Hood Medal for outstanding advance in photography for public service. Recent publications include [Peace Photography: A Guide](#) and [Imaging Peace](#) (EUP, 2026).
